## Dublin Internship Program

The Boston University Summer internship program in Dublin, Ireland offers students the opportunity to spend eight weeks studying and interning in Dublin, one of Europe's most vibrant and cosmopolitan cities. Students combine a professional internship with one liberal arts course. Classes are held at Dublin City University (DCU) and are conducted by faculty from both Dublin City University and University College Dublin.

Upon successful completion of the summer program, students will receive a total of eight Boston University credits.

### Courses

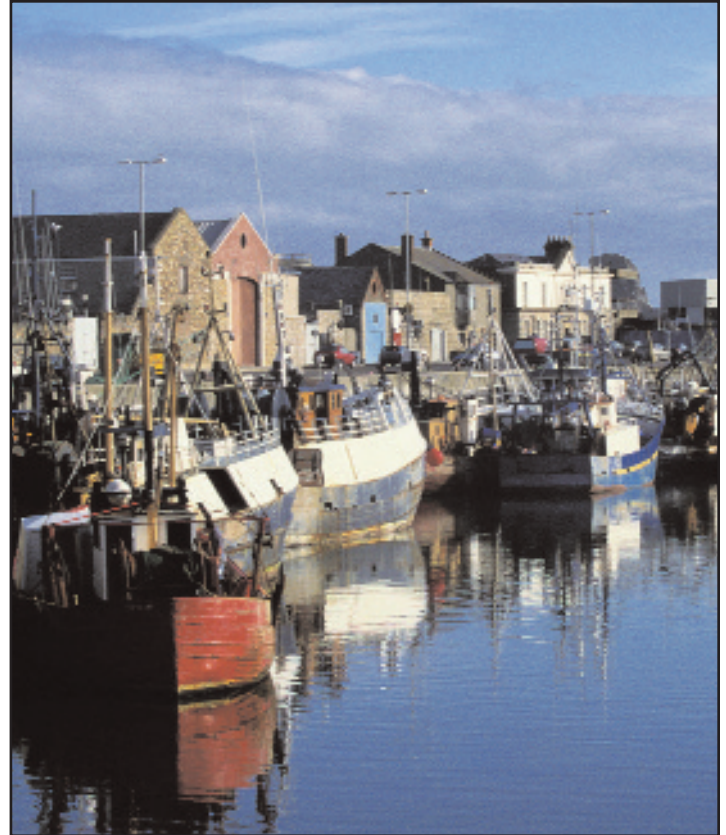
Students enroll in one of the following courses and an internship course:

CAS EN 392 Modern Irish Literature, 4 cr.  
CAS SO 341 Contemporary Irish Society, 4 cr.  
CAS HI 325/PO 381 The History of Ireland, 4 cr.

### Internship Areas

Placements are contingent upon the student's past experience, professional interests, and available opportunities during the summer term, so flexibility is essential.

Internship areas include, but are not limited to: Advertising or Public Relations, Arts and Architecture, Broadcasting and Film, Business and Economics, Health and Human Services, Hospitality Administration, Journalism, Visual and Performing Arts, International Organization, Politics and Comparative Law.

### Housing

Students live in apartment-style residences on or adjacent to the campus of Dublin City University. These recently constructed buildings feature ensuite bedrooms in apartments for five to 10 students with shared kitchens and living rooms.

- Minimum GPA: 3.0 (in major and overall)

### Program Dates

Summer Term: early June-late July

### Application Deadline

Summer Term: March 1

### Summer 2009 Program Cost

\$7,300. Cost includes tuition, housing, field trips, and emergency travel assistance coverage. Costs for Summer 2010 have yet to be announced and will be subject to approval by the Board of Trustees of Boston University. Financial aid is available.
